[Fierce street battles rage as troops enter Ladha](#)

WANA/PESHAWAR: At least 30 militants were killed and eight soldiers, including two officers, sustained injuries in heavy clashes and street fighting as the troops entered the Taliban stronghold of Ladha on Wednesday. Official sources said the fighting continued in Ladha and Srarogha and the troops cleared a major part of Srarogha following its capture a day earlier and withdrawal of most of the militants from the area. The political administration officials said the troops also entered Sam, Gadwai, Asman Manza and Karwan Manza areas of the agency. They said the troops faced tough resistance from the militants in Gadwai during their advance towards Ladha. However, security forces managed to reach there after clashes with militants.

[Bomb Hits Near Crowded Market in Pakistan](#)

PESHAWAR, Pakistan (AP) -- A suspected car bomb exploded outside a crowded market in northwest Pakistan on Tuesday, killing 20 people in the latest attack by suspected militants apparently aimed at avenging an army offensive along the Afghan border. The bombing, which was aimed at causing maximum civilian casualties, was the third blast in as many days in or close to Peshawar, the capital of the North West Frontier Province. It took place in Charsadda, some 25 miles (40 kilometers) north of Peshawar, destroying scores of shops on both sides of the road and knocked down electrical wires. Officials suspected the bomb was planted in a car outside the market, said police officer Rokhan Zeb Khan.

[26 die in Charsadda market suicide blast Three women, six children among dead:](#)

CHARSADDA/PESHAWAR: Twenty-six people, including three women and six children, were killed and 104 others sustained injuries when a car bomb rocked a busy market in Tehsil Bazaar near the Farooq-e-Azam Chowk in Charsadda on Tuesday. Some sources put the death toll at 32. The senior superintendent of police (SSP) Coordination, Mohammad Alam Shinwari, however, told The News that 24 people were killed and 104 others sustained injuries in the blast. He confirmed that around 60 kilograms of explosives were used in the bombing. Eyewitnesses said the people were busy shopping when a suicide bomber exploded his explosive-laden car near a fruit shop around 4:24 pm.

in Hangu, Orakzai, Kohat and Darra Adamkhel said six motorcycles and 19 vehicles were to be stuffed with explosives and used in suicide bombings against security and law-enforcement forces and other targets.

[At Least 13 Die in a Bombing in Pakistan](#)

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan — Insurgents continued to torment the northern city of Peshawar on Saturday, bombing a police checkpoint in the fifth attack on the city in a week. Peshawar is a crowded frontier city on the edge of Pakistan's mountainous western tribal regions that has become the main target of insurgent violence. The authorities said that the bomber detonated a truck filled with explosives, killing himself and at least 12 other people. The Associated Press reported that four children were among the dead. Twenty-five people were injured, according to a police official who asked not to be identified because he was not authorized to speak to the media. One of the dead, the official said, was a police officer who stopped the bomber's vehicle from entering the city's crowded downtown, possibly preventing a higher toll.
