PESHAWAR/JAMRUD: Three Pakistan Army officials, including a brigadier and a major, were killed and two others sustained serious injuries in a military gunship chopper (Cobra) crash and an ambush on a rescue team that was proceeding towards the Tirah Valley in the troubled Khyber Agency to recover bodies and wreckage of the helicopter, reportedly shot down by suspected militants on Wednesday.

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan — A suicide attack on a military vehicle in the Swat Valley has killed at least six people, including two soldiers, according to a Pakistani security official and local news outlets. The bomber, who according to the official was on foot, attacked a vehicle in central Mingora, the main town of Swat. Dozens of people were reported to have been injured in the attack. The Pakistan military launched an offensive against Taliban forces in Swat last May. Many Taliban fighters, however, melted away without a major confrontation. About two million people were displaced in Swat and the surrounding area during the offensive, and about a million have returned. The suicide attack on Monday was the first since December.

[Bomber Kills 4 at Police Post in Pakistan](#)

ISLAMABAD, Pakistan (AP) — A suicide car bomber attacked a police station on Saturday in northwestern Pakistan, killing four people and wounding about two dozen, underscoring the continuing security threat to the country despite army operations against militants. Also, a paramilitary commander said his forces had killed 25 militants in another area of the volatile frontier region. The blast at the police station in Karak in North-West Frontier Province also toppled a mosque next door, said Ajmal Khan, a government official. Two police officers and two civilians were killed; police officers and civilians were among the wounded.
