[Man killed in Chhattisgarh for not attending Maoist meet](#)

Maoist militants have killed a tribal man for not attending a public meeting organised by them in Chhattisgarh's Surguja district, police said on Saturday. The rebels gunned down a Pahari Korva tribe member and assaulted his family members late Friday in Bhutha village in Surguja district, about 500 km from Raipur. "There is a report that Maoists forced a tribal family to attend their meeting. When they did not do so, the rebels shot dead the head of the family and beat up others," Director General of Police Vishwaranjan told reporters Raipur

In the latest incident, a gun battle broke out in the wee hours today between militants and security forces in Hafruda forests of Handwara area - where a major encounter took place in March this year in which 17 militants and eight Army soldiers were killed

SRINAGAR, Aug 5: Seven militants were killed in three separate operations, including a foiled infiltration bid near the Line of Control (LoC) in Tangdhar sector, launched by the security forces in Kupwara district of Kashmir valley, officials said here. Alert Army troops foiled an infiltration bid by militants, who had managed to sneak in to Tangdhar sector from Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), after noticing the movement of the heavily armed ultras, Defence Spokesman Lt Colonel J S Brar said. He said three militants had been killed in the exchange of gun fire with the security forces till reports last came in. Brar said the operation was still going on

JAMMU, Aug 4: Pakistan's SIM Even as there was no let up in smuggling of mobile phones and cards by the truckers and civilians from across the Line of Control (LoC) to Poonch, Pakistan army today appeared to have conducted a trial to smuggle arms and explosives in the trucks by sending iron rods, empty cold drinks, nut and bolts etc in the bags of dal moong during weekly trade on Poonch-Rawlakote route. While

three truck operators were detained with mobile telephones, Nokia batteries and SIM cards of Pakistan telecom company U Fone, another truck operator was found smuggling pieces of iron rods, empty cold drink bottles, nut and bolts in six large bags mixed with dal moong

[Death for three in 2003 Mumbai bomb blasts case](#)

Mumbai: A special Prevention of Terrorism Act (POTA) court here on Thursday sentenced to death all the three persons convicted in the bomb blasts case of 2003. The explosions claimed 54 lives and injured 244 people. The case comprises blasts at the Gateway of India and Zaveri Bazaar on August 25, 2003, the blast aboard a bus at Ghatkopar on July 28, 2003 and the planting of a bomb in a bus in the Santa Cruz Electronics Export Processing Zone on December 2, 2002, which, however, did not explode

New Delhi: Contrary to the demands of the Opposition and a section of the media, the government does not believe the fate of any one individual can serve as an "acid test" of Pakistan's commitment to act against the perpetrators of last November's terrorist attacks in Mumbai. But senior officials acknowledge the line they are walking is a fine one, demanding that Islamabad act against high profile terror propagandists like Lashkar-e-Taiba chief Hafiz Saeed while not allowing the future course of Indian engagement with Pakistan to be narrowly tied to his status alone

COLOMBO: Sri Lanka on Friday said it would deal with the self-proclaimed LTTE

leader Kumaran Pathmanathan, known as KP, arrested from a country in the Asian region and flown here on Thursday night, in accordance with "domestic laws and international norms." Speaking at a special press briefing here, defence spokesperson and Minister Keheliya Rambukwella said the new LTTE leader was in military custody and would be questioned about LTTE operations overseas, including foreign assets. He said Sri Lanka was willing to consider any request by other countries to question KP based on bilateral and international conventions and treaties

An alert was sounded all along the Jammu-Pathankote national highway and Jammu-Lakhanpur railway track following unconfirmed reports that a couple of militants might have succeeded in intruding into the Indian side during heavy exchange of firing with the Border Security Force (BSF) though senior officers of the BSF categorically denied that any militant had infiltrated from the IB

The dossier, handed over by Foreign Secretary Nirupama Rao to Pakistani High Commissioner Shahid Malik, is the sixth set of documents passed on to Islamabad to enable it to conduct investigations into the Mumbai attacks

Kharak_telco@yahoo.com was the email ID used by wanted accused while communicating with terrorists via Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) through New Jersey-based Callphonex, Mukund Pawar, Crime Branch inspector, told special public prosecutor Ujjwal Nikam during examination in the court
