The two men named this man, a prominent minister's son Yunus Ansari as the conduit between King Gyanendra's son Paras and India's most wanted terrorist Dawood Ibrahim, who between them have been pushing crores of fake currency into India

Days after India handed over a fresh dossier to help make out a case against Jamaat-ud-Dawah (JuD) chief Hafiz Saeed, Home Minister P Chidambaram slammed Pakistan for not acting against the perpetrators of the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks. India has already given half-a -dozen dossiers and clarifications to Islamabad over the last eight months on the role of Pakistani citizens in the Mumbai attack "Pakistan is not serious about prosecuting and punishing those responsible for perpetrating the Mumbai attack," he told a press conference. Chidambaram also said the terror infrastructure, that was used to carry out attacks like the one in Mumbai, was intact. "That is my complaint against Pakistan and that is my disappointment with Pakistan," he said

**'Pak must act against 26/11 accused'**

NEW DELHI: Ahead of his meeting with the Pakistani foreign minister on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly in New York, S M Krishna said it was Pakistan's responsibility to take action against the Mumbai accused before India started any kind of dialogue with its neighbour. Addressing the Editors Guild, Krishna said, "There should be concrete action against those guilty of the Mumbai terrorist attacks before there can be any meaningful dialogue with Pakistan. Until the Mumbai attacks, India was conducting the composite dialogue with utmost sincerity. But we cannot have terrorism and negotiations at the same time. Pakistan has to prove its credentials by implementing its assurances."
