

[India plays down Chinese incursions](#)

NEW DELHI: India on Monday sought to play down incursions by the Chinese into its territory with highly placed government officials stating that this was a fallout of the absence of "mutually agreed" Line of Actual Control (LAC) between the two countries. This was even as Indian Army chief Gen Deepak Kapoor admitted incursion by a Chinese chopper two months ago. While the number of Chinese incursions into Indian territory remains as high as last year, Indian officials said that such "transgression" must be seen in the proper context. "The fact is that we don't yet have a mutually agreed LAC. We have proposed an early clarification from China on LAC, but so far there has been no response from Beijing," a top government official said
