"Army is yet to achieve a breakthrough and with each passing day, the chances of success are becoming bleak," a source said

Observing that ceasefire violations by Islamabad were on the rise, Army Chief Gen Deepak Kapoor said the Pakistan army was resorting to firing on the border to push in maximum militants before winter to "disrupt" the peaceful environment of Jammu and Kashmir. JAMMU, Sept 10: Even after Tuesday night's failed infiltration attempt in Mendhar sector, the commanders of two major militant outfits with the help of Pakistan army and Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) have kept several militants in the group of four to eight at launching pads near Line of Control (LoC) opposite twin border districts of Poonch and Rajouri to push them, getting an opportunity, into this side. Pakistan army and the militant commanders of Lashkar-e-Toiba (LeT) and Hizbul Mujahideen (HM) want to push as many militants as possible into Indian territory from the LoC before the onset of winter which will close down some of the passes due to snowfall.

[Two cops, woman killed: 10 injured in car blast](#)

SRINAGAR, Sept 12: In the biggest strike of the year so far in Kashmir Valley, militants today blew up a police vehicle by triggering a massive car bomb, killing two cops and a woman and injuring 10 others outside the Central jail in the Rainawari area of the summer capital here, officials said. The ultras had parked an explosive laden Maruti car at a short distance away from the Central jail at Kathidarwaza in the old city area and used a remote control device to blow up the car as a police bus was passing by, the officials said. "It was a car bomb used by militants ... so far, three persons have been killed while another 10 are injured," Inspector General of Police (IGP) Kashmir Farooq Ahmad Dar told EXCELSIOR

Arms dropped from Pak army post into Indian village
