

[Afghan double suicide attack kills, wounds 20](#)

KANDAHAR, Afghanistan (AP) — A double suicide bomb attack killed and wounded at least 20 people in southern Afghanistan on Sunday, an official said. The majority of casualties were police and army units responding to the initial attack. The first suicide bomber detonated his explosives near a taxi stand and police checkpoint in the town of Gereshk in Helmand province, the world's largest poppy-growing region and the country's most violent province. Helmand deputy provincial police chief Kamaluddin Khan said when police and army units responded to the scene, a second suicide bomber on foot detonated his explosives, causing a majority of the casualties

In a series of interviews, senior US and Iraqi officials and US intelligence officers say they expect gains made against Al Qaeda in Iraq (AQI) to continue to limit the group's ability to destabilize stronger Iraqi security forces and a more confident government
